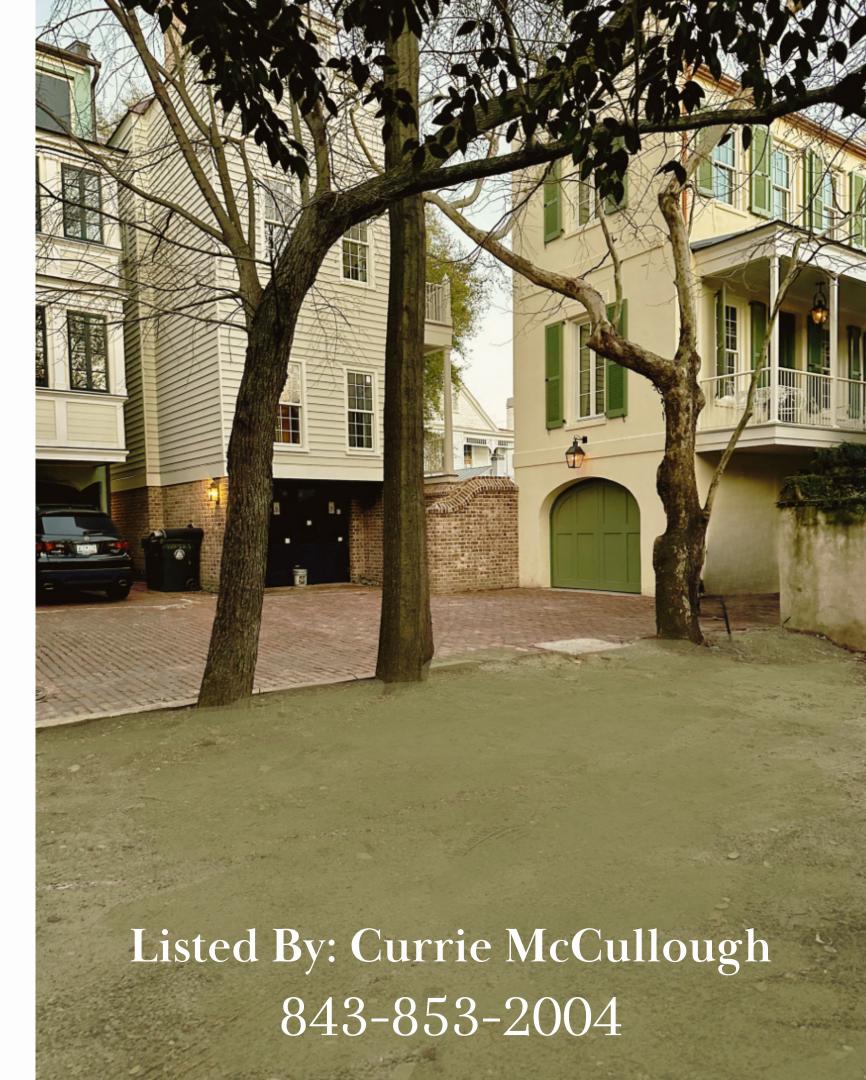

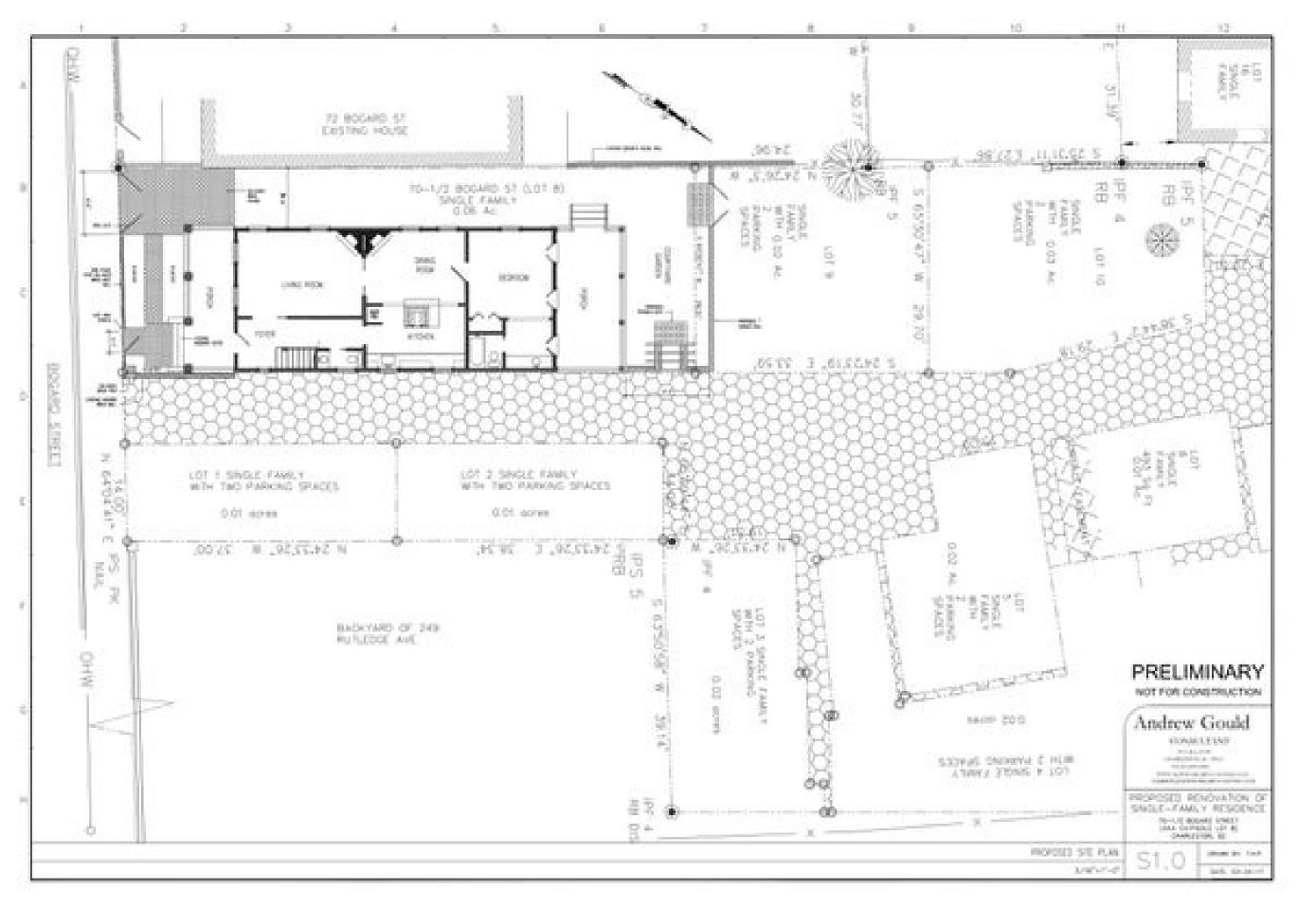


CATFIDDLE STREET STYLE

FOR LOVERS OF ARCHITECTURE NEW AND OLD

Founded in 2014 when several adjoining properties, and other separately owned tiny land parcels were joined together to include 24 residential lots on just under one acre.

"The urban plan for Catfiddle Street is organic. As opposed to a typical urban row or lane which form a rigid passage, the street is intertwined with the architecture and private space is intertwined with public space in an unexpected, yet intentional way. Buildings are built right up to the street, allowing the houses themselves to take on slightly uneven angles as they accommodate the curved shape of the street.

The open areas between buildings are owned and maintained by the households, and the road itself is a place to stay, not just a place to pass through"-Urban Ergonomics
